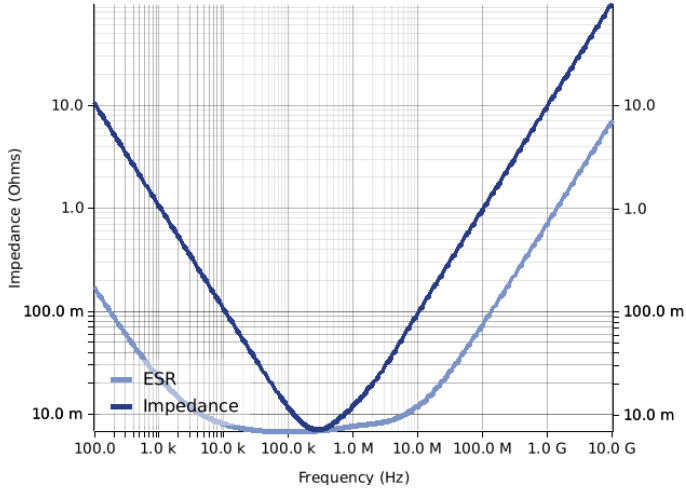

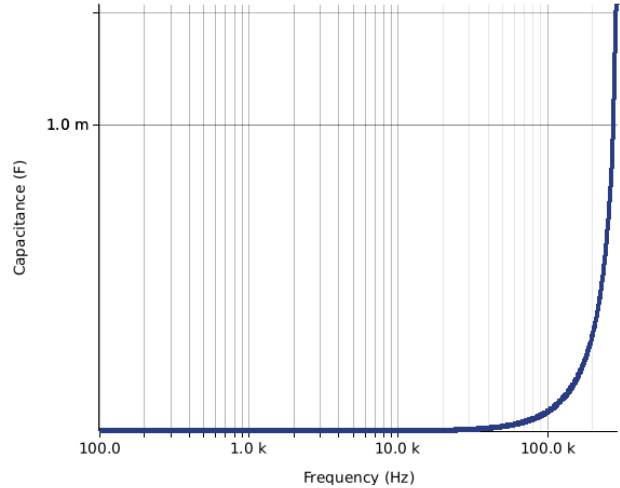

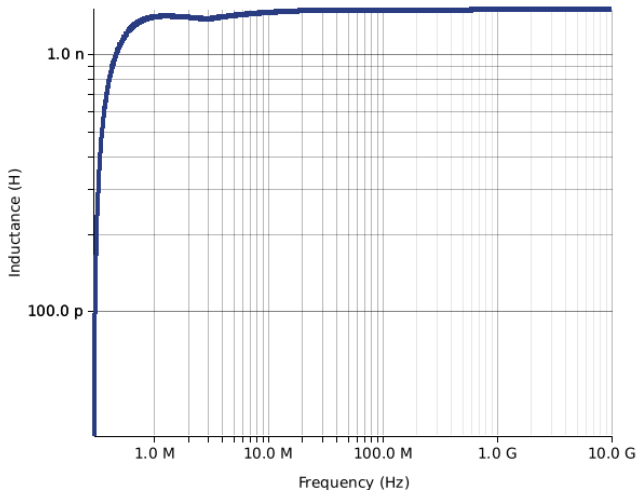

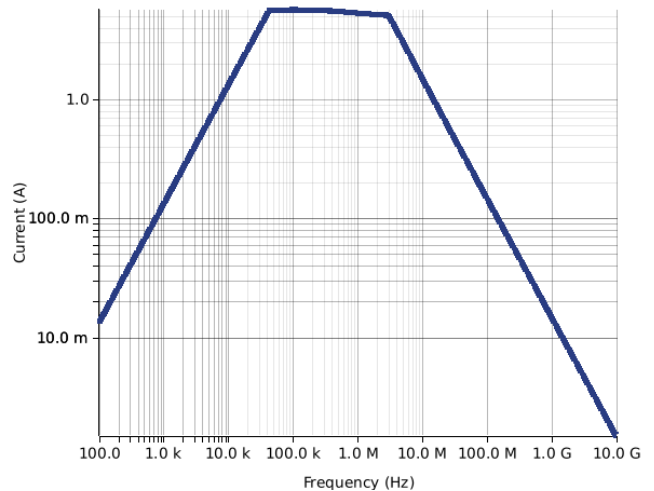
Capacitance



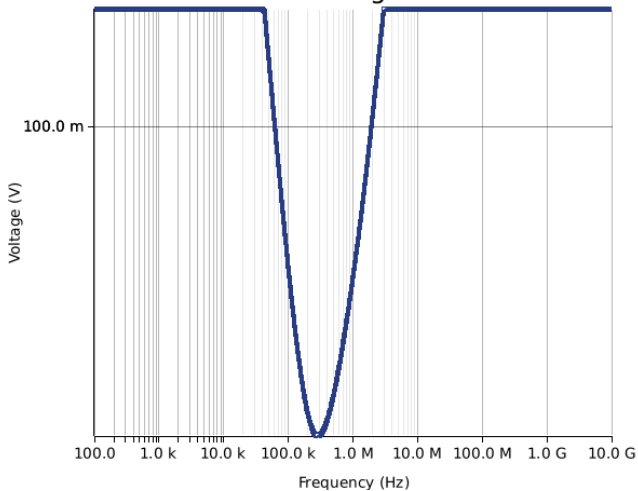
Inductance



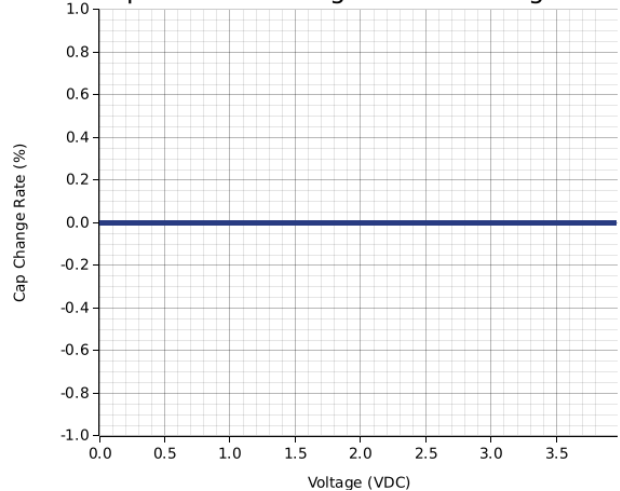

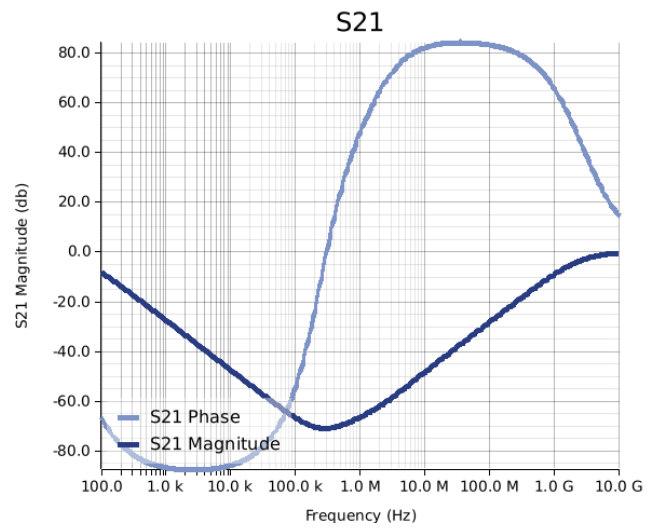
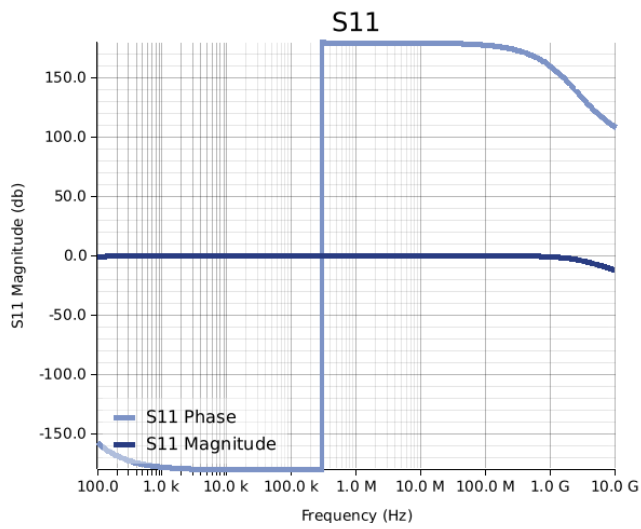


Voltage
